As a Family Medicine physician, I will be fully equipped not only to dutifully handle any and all situations, but also to fully expound on my training.

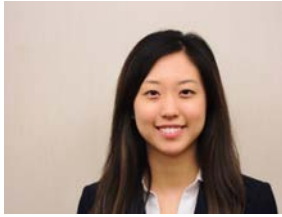


Eric Fredell
